Tuesday March 22nd. - More in Common Music Night - curated by Peace through Folk, in association with people from all genres of performing arts.

There are five months of 2022 when there will be an extra Tuesday. On those occasions we plan to organise these special nights, usually at the Roebuck when almost anything musical might happen!

The programme will be pre-planned and feature all sorts of performers and genre of music. The aim is to celebrate the rich diversity in communities, their cultures, and their music, showing that there is 'More in Common than that which divides'.
