103 years since the death of Private William McBride

I feel the need to express my personal thoughts and fears which I believe are shared by so many people at this very troubled time.

Thanks to the blundering stupidity of 'Cameron the gambler' and the lies that fuelled the slim majority in an 'Advisory' Referendum the lemmings are all charging for the cliffs.

"Adolf Hitler's rise to power began in Germany in September 1919 when he joined the political party then known as the Deutsche Arbeiterpartei – DAP (German Workers' Party). The name was changed in 1920 to the Nationalsozialistische Deutsche Arbeiterpartei – NSDAP (National Socialist German Workers' Party, commonly known as the Nazi Party). This political party grew and developed during the post-World War I era. It was opposed to the democratic post-war government of the Weimar Republic and the Treaty of Versailles, advocating extreme nationalism and Pan-Germanism as well as virulent anti-Semitism. Hitler's "rise" can be considered to have ended in March 1933, after the Reichstag adopted the Enabling Act of 1933 in that month. President Paul von Hindenburg had already appointed the un-elected Hitler as Chancellor on 30 January 1933 after a series of parliamentary elections and associated backroom intrigues. The Enabling Act authority- virtually assured that Hitler could thereafter constitutionally exercise dictatorial power without legal objection.

Adolf Hitler rose to a place of prominence in the early years of the party. Being one of its best speakers, he told the other members to either make him leader of the party or he would never return. He was aided in part by his willingness to use violence in advancing his political objectives and to recruit party members who were willing to do the same. The Beer Hall Putsch in November 1923 and the later release of his book Mein Kampf (Translation: My Struggle) expanded Hitler's audience. In the mid-1920s, the party engaged in electoral battles in which Hitler participated as a speaker and organizer, as well as in street battles and violence between the Rotfrontkämpferbund and the Nazis' Sturmabteilung (SA). Through the late 1920s and early 1930s, the Nazis gathered enough electoral support to become the largest political party in the Reichstag, and Hitler's blend of political acuity, deceptiveness and cunning converted the party's non-majority but plurality status into effective governing power in the ailing Weimar Republic of 1933.

Many rational leave voters must now be terrified at the pace that this deadly folly is unfolding again here and now in The UK and all across Europe.

Farage is arrogant enough to play his cards to the end and even, by his own words, to "- don khaki, pick up a rifle and head for the front lines" if Theresa May fails to deliver; Just like extremist leaders did in the 1930's.

The media is giving oxygen to the mob as it did in 1930s.

Most people are now filled with dread but still have faith and hope for the common decency of humanity when not roused to mob hysteria.

I believe that it is better to hope than to despair at this time. Many of us have been keeping quiet in our hopes – not wanting to un-leash even 1 more Dog of War by responding to the baying cries of the growing mob frenzy.
